



YOUTH DEVELOPMENT THROUGH HIP HOP



Title: The Residency Teaching Artist

Responsible to: Arts Corps and MoPOP Program Managers

Dates/Hours: Summer Residency: July 23rd- August 17, 2018 (90 hours instruction, 45 hours prep);

Fall Cypher: Dates TBD (3 hours instruction, 1.5 hours prep); **Youth interviews: Mid June** (17 hours at prep rate); additional planning times to be determined

Compensation: \$60/hour for instruction; \$30/hour for prep

Program Description

Arts Corps, MoPOP, and Macklemore & Ryan Lewis are collaborating to host year 4 of The Residency. The Residency breaks down the barriers of access to equitable arts experiences for underserved teens in the Seattle region in order to build their skills in collaboration, self-expression, technical acumen, leadership identity, and confidence as cultural change-makers. The intensive residency will serve 45 emerging artists through two tracks over four weeks. Each track will be lead by two teaching artists and a classroom assistant, serving 45 youth. The **Vocal Track** will foster self-expression through lyricism, rhyme structure, and delivery, and the **Production Track** will emphasize media literacy, beat-making, and song construction. Following the residency, youth will participate in four monthly 3-hour cyphers (from September through December) as a way to advance their collaborative learning, workshop ideas with their cohort artists, and sustain the sense of shared community and motivation after the completion of the four-week residency.

Job Description

The Residency Teaching Artist will deliver high quality hip hop arts curriculum which engages and develops participants' creativity, builds technical skillset, provides leadership opportunities, and helps to shape their identities as cultural workers. Partnering with fellow teaching artists, classroom assistants, youth interns and program managers, this person will work collaboratively to meet the objectives of the program including: curriculum development and implementation, support with youth recruitment and selection process, classroom management, and event planning & production.

Primary Responsibilities:

- Develop and implement high quality hip hop arts curriculum
- Collaborate with fellow teaching artist to lesson plan and co-teach
- Support youth recruitment and selection process (including interviews and follow up)
- Participate in program planning meetings
- Participate in daily pre session check in and post session debrief
- Create a safe and engaging learning environment for participants
- Partner with and supervise classroom assistant
- Participate in and support program evaluation efforts (student surveys, focus groups, etc)



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- Participate in event planning and production for August 10th culminating event
- Support documentation collection (including participant paperwork, attendance, etc)
- Participate in 2 day professional development training prior to residency (date TBD)
- Commit to attend the assigned classes at all scheduled class times for the entire four week residency and scheduled Cyphers

Qualifications:

- Experience teaching youth ages 16-19
- Knowledge of, and skills in vocal and/or music production
- A strong youth development framework and commitment to social justice
- Knowledge of Hip Hop history and culture
- Experience with curriculum development and lesson planning
- Ability to create safe and engaging learning environments
- Knowledge of the South Seattle community and issues impacting youth
- Demonstrated capacity for working all assigned hours during summer residency and fall cypher(s)
- Availability to participate in team planning and professional development in the months leading up to residency
- Demonstrated capacity to be flexible and persistent in the face of challenge
- Well organized with good administrative skills
- Strong interpersonal and collaborative skills with the ability to connect with both youth and adults

We are seeking candidates that are exceptional creative role models with strong youth development skills and a commitment to social justice.
